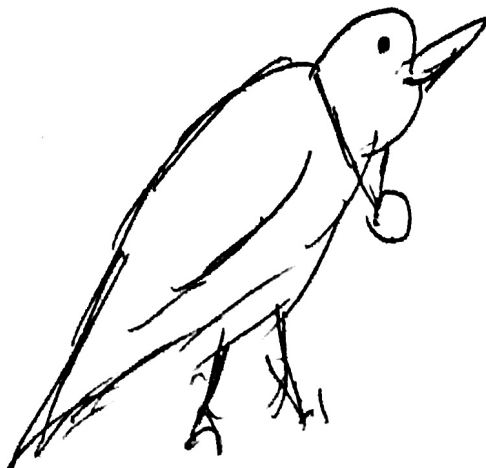


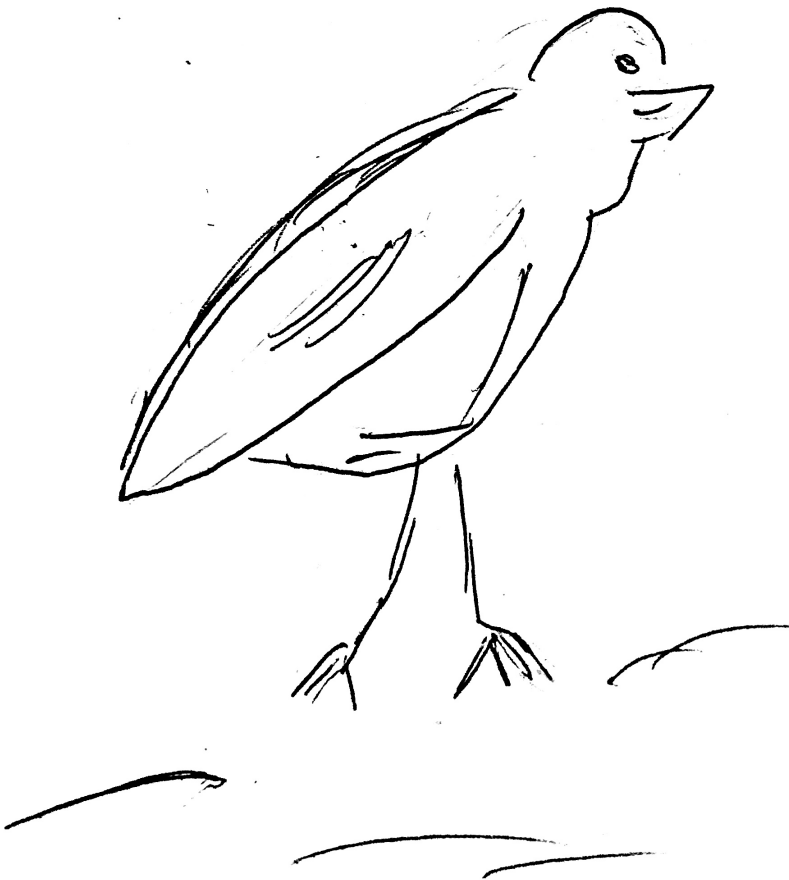

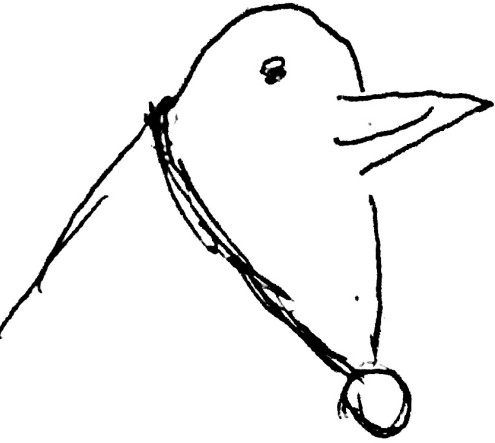

Alvin was a good finch.



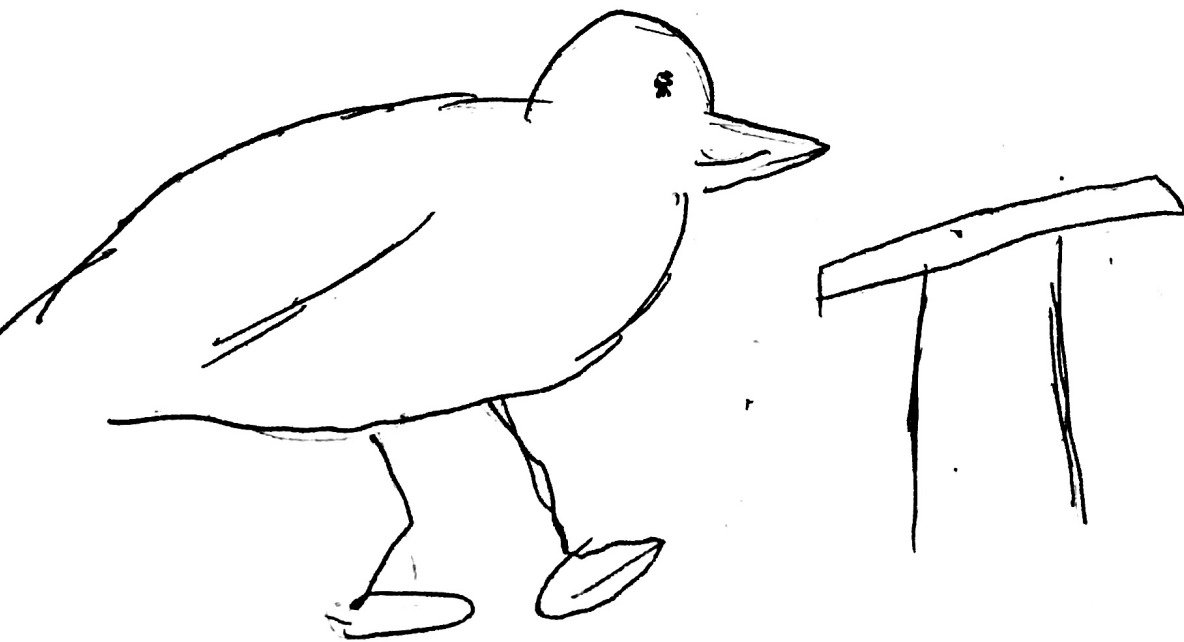
People told him he was good at running -- so he ran.



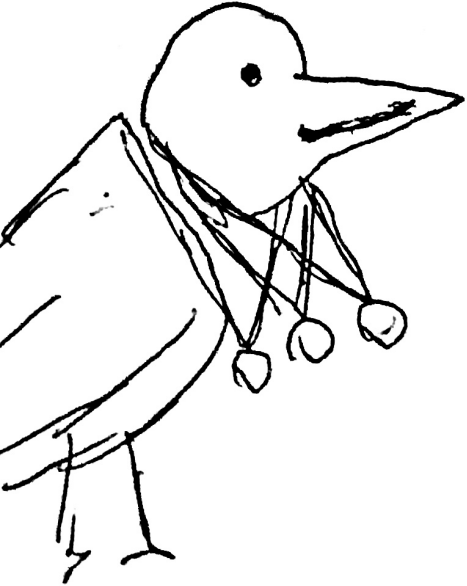

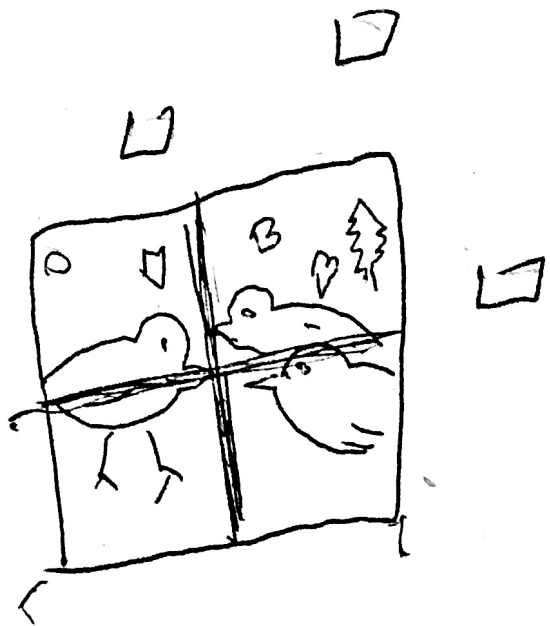
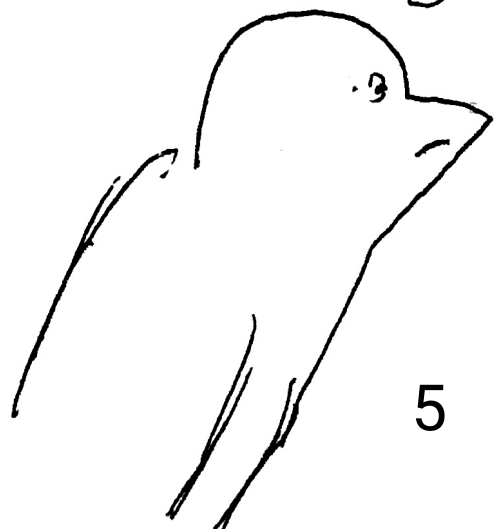
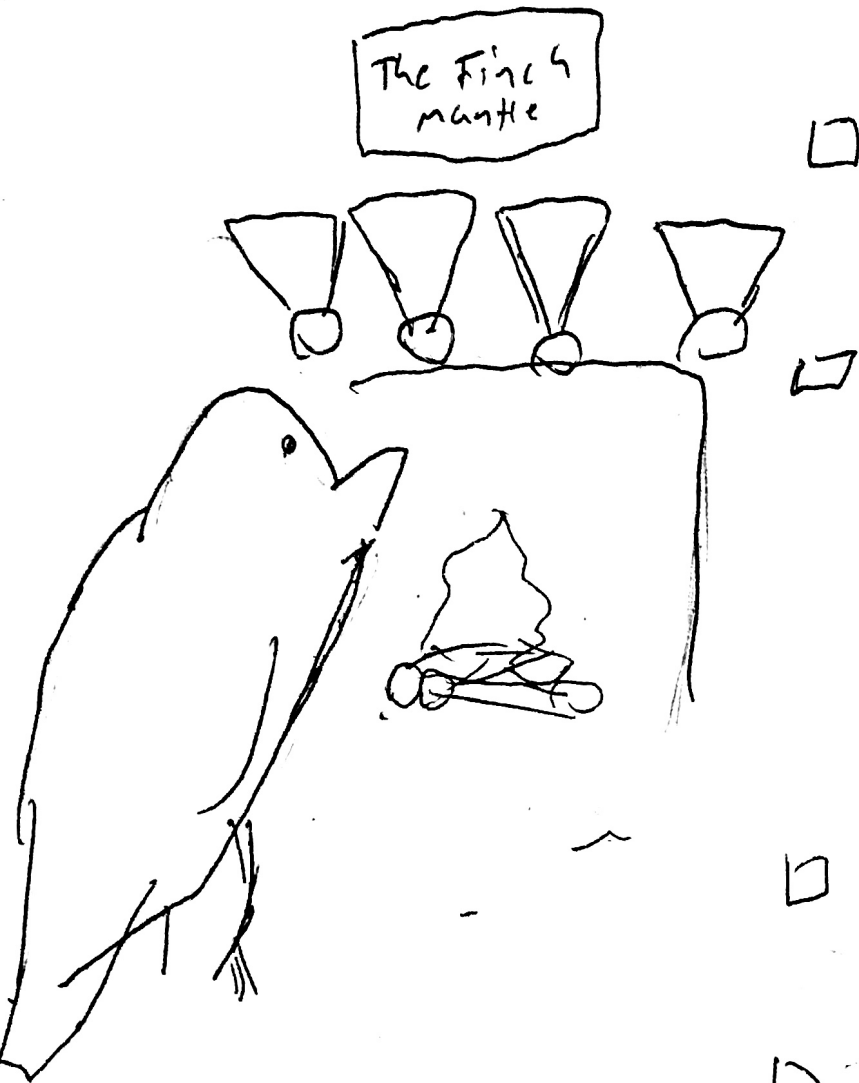
He got better at running, so he started to jump.



He started jumping, and he was pretty good at that too.



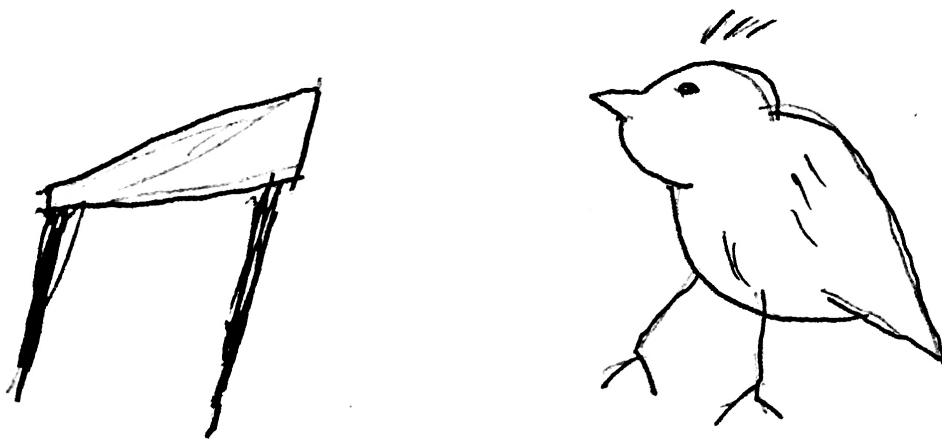
They gave him a jumping medal.

One day he stopped



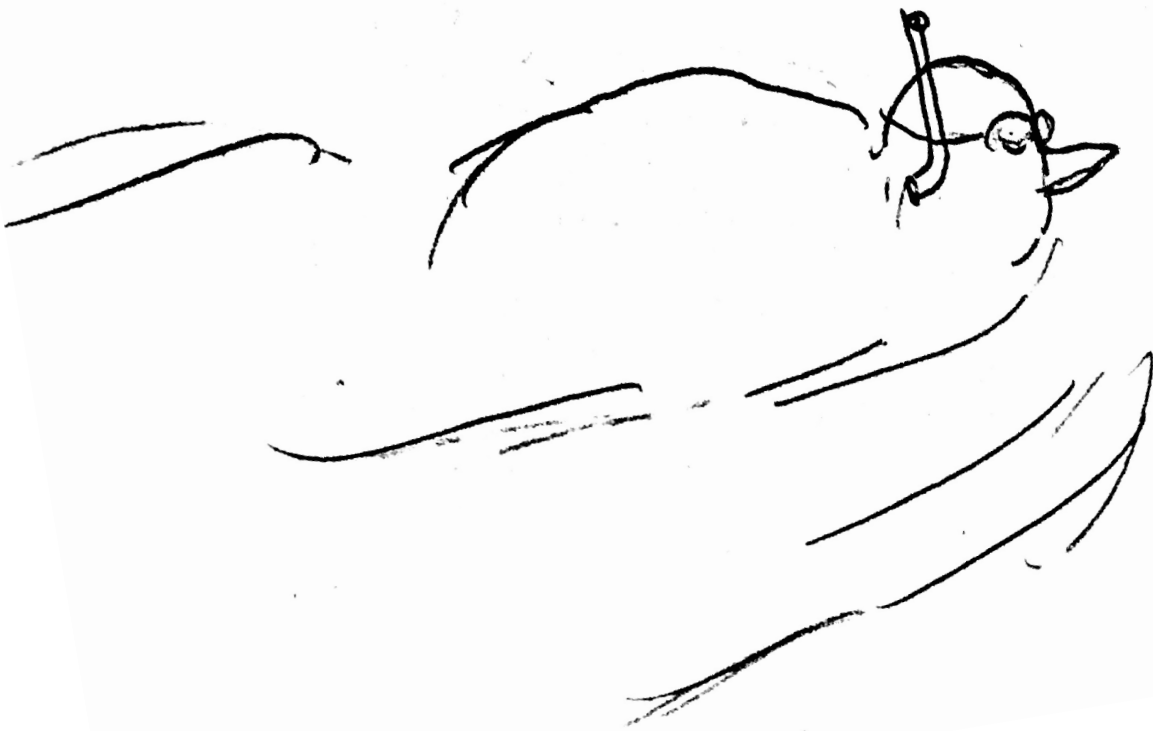
He felt strange. People told him,

He tried swimming. He wasn't very much good at that either.



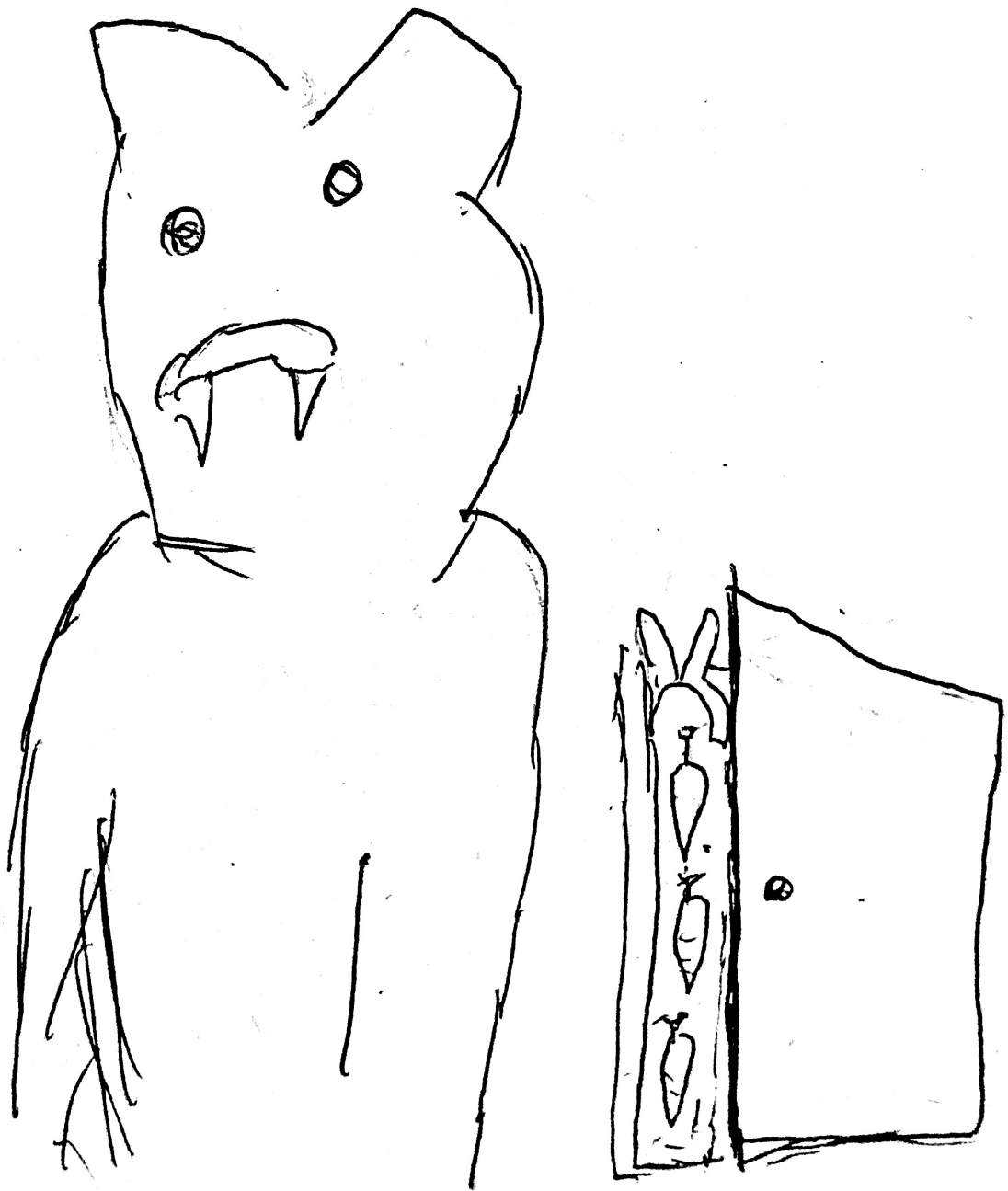
Alvin felt like a failure.

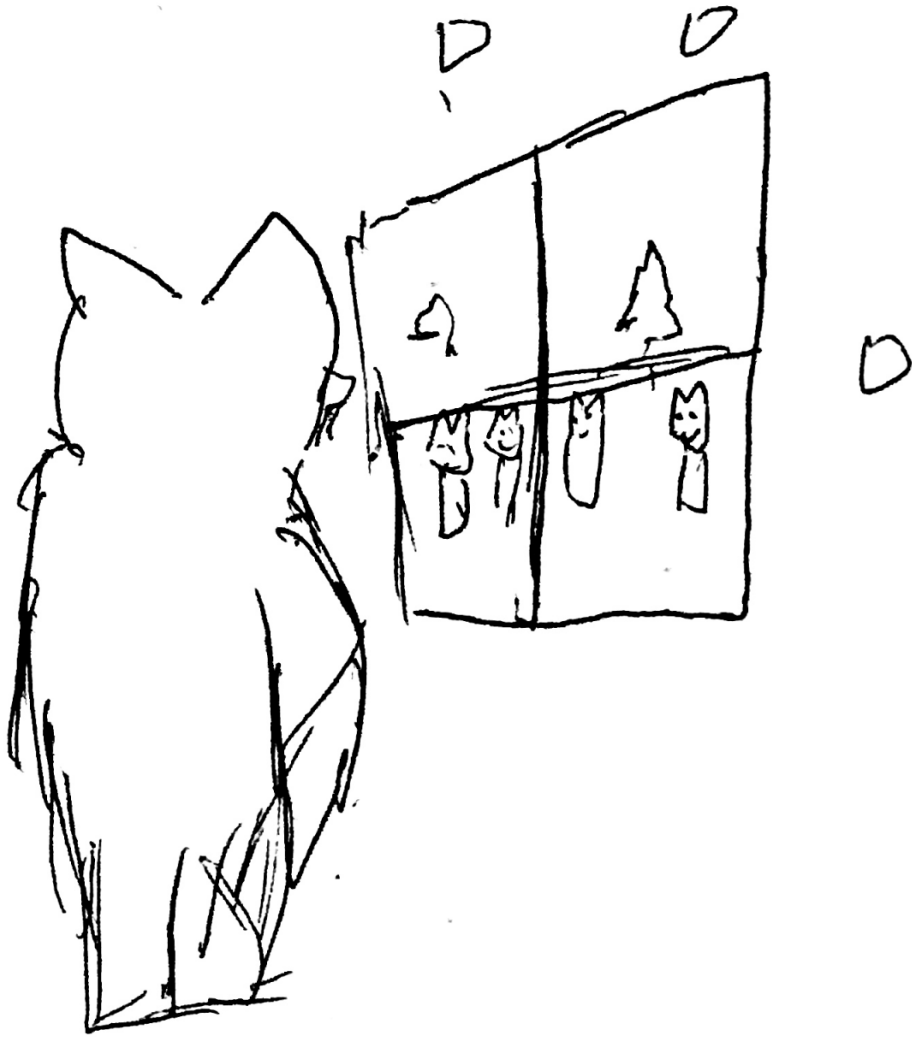
